The colder weather has caused some of the trap shooters to move to Florida in the winter and others have put their guns away until the Spring. For those that still want to shoot in the winter, remember to let the pump warm up for a while.

If machine throws random targets, shut off machine and let pump warm up some more. Any issues, let me know.

Colchester Fish & Game is using the lower fields during the skeet Winter League, try to work around their schedule to avoid any conflict. Generally field 5 is setup for trap doubles, that is not the case in the winter. You can shoot regular trap on field 5.

Congratulation to Bob Cooper for making the ATA All-American team. Quite an accomplishment! Bob had shot over 11,000 registered targets in 2015, he has over 118,000 lifetime registered targets. Can't imagine how many he shot in practice alone!

CLUB NEWS

First, the driveway from Chewink Road down about 200 ft. was recently paved, leveled and finished surface paved. In doing this a new storm drain was installed and the old center post with sign was removed and installed on the side. The area outside the kitchen window and to the hall entrance was leveled and final surface put down. The road from field 1 through to the end at the pistol range was given a new road millings coat. We replaced the trap house roof on field 3, and will be renovating the brown skeet bldg. with new windows and come spring extending a new roof over the front deck. So there is a lot of infrastructure upgrading going on. We still have a way to go. When you see notices about work days or help needed for a project, set that day aside and come out. Not only helping the Club to grow but you'll meet other members as well.

Recently the Colchester Fish & Game Club lost the use of their only skeet field. They approached our Club to see if it was possible for them to use a couple of fields until they can correct their situation. We have eight fields, and only use 4 as we only have 4 winter league teams. It was not only doing the right thing, but it's another Sportsman Club in need. Colchester brings to our Club, their six teams to shoot their winter matches and practice. Our Club has shown a great welcome to them.

At the pistol range we have plate shooting on both sides of the range and will be installing a dueling plate tree for additional fun. As with ALL RANGES guns down range all the time, no handling of any gun while individuals are down range for target changes. The pistol range is for pistols only, only rim fire rifles are allowed, no pistol more powerful than a 41 mag are allowed on the range. All shotguns, muzzleloaders/black powder guns, hand guns more powerful than a 41 mag. and center fire rifles on the rifle range ONLY. All ranges required eye and ear protection all the time.
