TREASURER'S REPORT

Well the summer is here for 2012 and that means sunny days, warm weather and hunt tests for the dogs. The Executive Board has been discussing the fees we charge and our current dues structure. The Fin is in good financial health, but we need to make improvements including renovations to the club house and the skeet houses. We could upgrade the heating system, and improve the fields we have. All of these things cost money. As a club we need to address these costs.

Our President indicated to me that some members feel that our accounts are flush enough and no increases should happen. I thought maybe I should indicate some of our expenses that will come due soon. Last month the Fin paid \$13,000 for targets, and we will soon need to pay \$10,000 for taxes, \$11,000 for pheasants, and to purchase \$20,000 in grain. These are just the big bills and they total \$54,000. Our most recent financial report showed the Fin has \$100,000 in cash of which approximately \$24,000 is in Assessment #2 land and \$10,000 is in capital improvement. So that means the Fin has future large expenses of about \$54,000 and a bank account of \$67,000 from which to pay it.

I share this analysis not to cause alarm with regards to our ability to pay our bills but to demonstrate that we don't have a lot of extra cash. The Fin needs to somehow increase income by about 20 % (or decrease expenses) to enable us to do the proper maintenance and improvements to our facilities. It was in light of these financial challenges that potential increased prices at the bar, skeet, trap, five stand, and birds were considered.

MEMBERSHIP

The Associate membership continues to grow, it appears that shooting sports are what most new members are interested in. Last year we ended with 375 Regular & 123 Associate members.

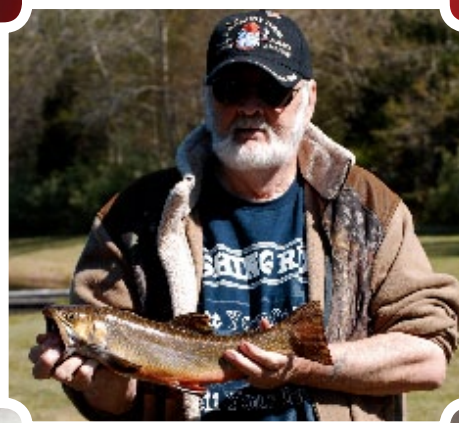
FIN, FUR, & FEATHER CLUB MODERN SKEET AND SKAP INFORMAL SUMMER LEAGUES

1. The Modern Skeet league and the SKAP league will be open to FFF members and their guests. If you would like to participate in one or both leagues and know any non-members who might like to try either league, or even try a few rounds, please extend an invitation. It will be okay to shoot-for-score either Modern Skeet or SKAP with shooters who are not in a league. Let's try to promote our club and invite skeet and/or trap shooters who want to try something new, and have some fun.
2. The league costs will be \$18 for either Modern Skeet or SKAP, or \$25 for both Modern Skeet and SKAP. Rounds shot will be at additional charge, and the usual member or guest range fees will apply. League fees will be used for a picnic and awards. Weather permitting, we'll have a shoot-off in the morning and a picnic/award event in the early afternoon of September 15, 2012.
3. The Modern Skeet league and the SKAP league will each consist of 12 rounds; rounds may be shot at the convenience of members and their guests. Except for the shoot-off date, **no formal practice or shooting dates/times will be scheduled.** Though shooting rounds-for-score with non-league members is encouraged, when practical please try to shoot your rounds-for-score with at least one other league participant.
4. SKAP will be shot on Field 4 and Modern Skeet will be shot on field 8. Score sheets and rules will be filed in high houses 4 and 8. Score sheets should be turned in at the bar when you pay for your rounds.
5. You may shoot the 12 required rounds for either league anytime between June 15, 2012, and September 9, 2012. Because rounds may be shot when you wish, you may join the league anytime between now and August 1, 2012.

There is a sign-up sheet posted on the bulletin board in the bar.

REGISTERED SKEET - 2012

The Fin held its annual NorthEast Open skeet shoot on June 2nd and 3rd. The turnout for the shoot was light in part due to terrible weather on Saturday, but 20-12Ga. shooters and 19-20 Ga. shooters participated. The Fin's Ed Prest shot 99/100 to capture the championship for the 12 Ga. In the 20 Ga. event John Mello drove from the Boston area in all the rain and shot a 99/100 to become the champion of this event. On Sunday the weather was near perfect with a sunny, cloudless sky and only a very soft wind. The 28 Ga. event was shot first and 17 shooters participated. When all the noise had ended the Fin's Ted Naumec posted a 99/100 and took the championship. Charles Connell Jr. was the B1 winner with 96/100 while Alan Gnann won C1 with 95/100. The .410 competition finished the day and weekend with 17 competitors vying for honors increased clouds and more wind. Charlie LaPointe posted a 98 to win the event with Josh St. Lawrence taking the Runner-up title with 95/100. Josh had a remarkable weekend since he refereed the 12 and 20 Ga. events on Saturday getting thoroughly soaked and then on Sunday shooting his first registered targets in many years and posting a 97/100 in the 28 Ga. and 95/100 in the .410.

In addition to Josh, Frank Decker and Bill Dixon shared the same rain on Saturday and refereed the shoot. Frank returned to do it all over again on Sunday and was joined by Neil Wippert and Mike D'Amato. Alan Perry, Elmer MacCluskey and Art St. Lawrence were there as usual to assist in any way possible. Mark Galligan worked the kitchen while Sean and Ian O'Reilly helped move the food back-and-forth and removed the garbage and performed general clean-up. Thanks to Connie Mauri for doing the weekend's cooking.

ZONE 1 SKEET SHOOT:

The weekend of August 9 – 12, 2012, will find the Fin hosting the Zone 1 shoot that involves participants from all of the New England States plus New York. We need a lot of help that weekend and in the weeks leading up to it. The field kitchen area and lower pavilion need to be cleaned thoroughly, the grass weed-whacked, the scoreboard cleaned, the fields edged and blown clear of skeet bird debris, hulls and wads, and the stations painted. Some carpentry needs doing particularly with fence reinforcement; the windows and doors also need some work. Each field needs a picnic table set up to help the shooters. We will be open on Thursday, August 9th for practice shooting and if past practice is repeated many shooters will show up to shoot throughout the day and again on Friday morning. We need people to pull targets, load houses and be generally hospitable to the competitors. Friday afternoon starts the shoot itself and again help is needed to assist shooters if necessary, to load houses, to clean the fields of hulls and other debris, to provide water for refreshment and to help in the lower kitchen area and in the clubhouse where we will provide a buffet meal after the shoot-offs. Saturday will need all of the above work in the listed areas plus help at the clubhouse as we prepare a dinner for the shooters and guests. Sunday will end the shoot and help is especially needed in the afternoon to clean the fields, the lower kitchen, remove garbage and return the picnic tables to the upper pavilion. PHEASANT HUNTING RULES

Hunting Chairman, Wayne Mather. 860-942-3385.

1. Pheasant hunters must wear badges and sign-in before hunting and sign-out after hunting.
2. After harvesting 2 birds, hunters must stop hunting for that day. There is no running of dogs after the 2-bird limit has been reached.
3. No permanent tree stands; portable stands are allowed with one stand/hunter property. The hunter's name must be affixed to the stand. Stands must be removed immediately following the season's end.
4. Turkey and deer harvested must be reported to the club within 24 hours.
5. Work hours must be completed by October 1st in order to hunt.
6. Park only in designated areas. There is no hunting in red zones. All Connecticut laws and regulations apply.
7. Any violation of Club rules or Connecticut regulations could result in disciplinary action.
