BY-LAWS REVISION

Members.

Our By-laws requires us to review them every five years, and if necessary make changes. Recently a review indicated some changes and these proposed changes will be voted upon on July 11th at the regular membership meeting. The By-laws are posted on the bulletin board in the bar, and were e-mailed for everyone's review. They're color coded to highlight these proposed changes. The biggest item is how the Executive Board is structured. Currently there are 7 members elected and with the lowest additional vote receivers are declared alternates. These alternates only have voting privileges when seated in absence of a full Board member to establish a quorum. This review committee and our current Executive Board felt we should remove the Alternates and make them full Board members as many times the alternates are seated as a full Board member. Presently, alternates have no voting or discussion on matters relating to the Club's operation, it's only when they are seated that they have full rights. So this change would create nine(9) Executive Board members, and along with this, additional changes in the By-laws throughout to expand board members from the seven(7) to nine(9). There are other changes along with this proposal, which reflects current day operations.

Please take time to read this proposal and attend the July 11th meeting to express your questions and to vote on these changes.

HUNTING BADGES

Please mark your calendars as you will need to purchase your 2017 badge prior to October 1st. After that date, no badges will be issued, unless you are a new regular member. You must fill out your permission slips, for selecting the type of hunting activity you would like, selecting your fall hunting group, and finally purchasing your badge. Come September 30th, if you have not completed your work hour requirement, or paid your obligations, you will be notified. You must pay for those work hours, and any outstanding obligations or you will lose your hunting privileges and your badge. Tremendous amount of work goes into this program from permission slips, organizing forms, verifying information on the permission slips, notifying members that information was incorrect or left out, cross checking work hours, obligations paid

for, and finally issuing badges. This is to ensure that everyone is eligible to hunt, after meeting those requirements.

It is your responsibility to make sure that information, work hours, obligations, and payments have been completed so to purchase your badge. Please keep your receipts. It is not up to the Hunt Chairman or Club, it is you!
