

# OUT IN THE FIELD

#### REGISTER SKEET

A new skeet season will soon be starting and the Fin will be participating in at least two registered shoots. The North East Open is our main shoot this year as we do not get the Zone or State. We will hold the shoot on May 31, June 1 & 2. Doubles will be shot on the 31st commencing at 2PM with 2 more flights separated by 1 hour each and then shoot-offs will be held. Saturday will see the 12 & 20 Ga. events shot followed on Sunday with the 28 Ga. and lastly the .410. We need help all three days and for a few days earlier. Grass needs trimming as do the sides of the cement walks and stations. The houses and machines need to be cleaned and filled with birds. Our plan is to use fields 1 – 4 but getting 5 ready as well would give us a fall back should any trouble occur on a field. The field kitchen needs to be cleaned and food must be brought down each day and excess food brought back to the clubhouse in the evening. Trash needs to be attended to and general housekeeping of the grounds must be done. We need referees for the shoots. My normal crew of referees will be called on to do this work (I Hope) but anyone interested in learning the ropes of this work should see me.

On July 14 we will hold a one day two gun shoot. A 12 Ga. event will be held in the morning and a 20 Ga. event in the afternoon. While this will be a smaller shoot many of the same jobs must still be done.

## **SPORTING CLAYS**

Well the season is just around the corner. We have the dates of the shoots which are listed below, the Connecticut Water Fowlers will again be here, and Ducks Unlimited will be coming back this year. So the season will be busy, I will be putting up sign up lists for both CWA and DU, as we need about 30 members for both shoots to trap and score. The 50 target shoots will be doing an e-mail a week or two before the shoot for workers. We will have a short work day on April 6th starting at 11 am to clear brush and put out the traps and some fences, meeting area is the skeet field pavilion, should only take about 2 hours. Please bring limb cutters, rakes, shovels, one or two chain saws will do the work needed. The dates are: May 5th at 9 am 50 targets, June 2nd at 9 am 50 targets. June 23rd is the Connecticut Waterfowlers starts at 9 am 100 targets, July 14th at 9 am 50 targets, August 11th at 9 am 50 targets, Sept. 7th(sat) Ducks Unlimited starts at 9 am 100 targets, and Sept. 22nd at 9am 50 targets, this will be the last shoot of the year, at the conclusion we will be picking everything away for the winter.
