Currently the club is in strong financial shape. The land fund is increasing in case we need to purchase some property. I thought that maybe you guys would like to know that our loan for the skeet fields is under \$60,000 and continuing with a double payment the loan will be paid off in about two more years. Having these loans paid off will loosen up monies for other major activities we the members deem worthwhile. As usual the Fin could use additional monies so any idea you have that could make some money please step up and organize it.

MEMBERSHIP

Currently the clubs membership is: Regular 333, Associate 166, Junior 33, Life 142. The club added 72 new members in 2013, however there were 70 people that did not renew their membership to the club this year. This is a little higher than normal. There were several people that indicated they loved the club, but were relocating out of State because of the State's current gun laws. SPORTING CLAYS

The season is fast approaching, and we need members to work each event. If you work you will get you work hours, a choice of either a breakfast or lunch sandwich just for sitting on a trap and having fun watching the shooters trying to break targets. The report time is 8 am and usually the finishing time is between 1 and 1:30 pm. We only need 7 members for the 50 target shoots; you can sign up before hand or wait until the e-mail goes out a week before the shoot. You can either call me at 860-933-4768 or e-mail rpalmer12@snet.net. We have two big shoots again this year, the CWA group will be here on Saturday June 21st which starts at 9 am, so report time is at 8 am, which goes till about 1 pm. The other shoot is Ducks Unlimited which is on a Saturday Sept. 6th, and that is the same time. These two shoots, I'll have a sign up list in the bar for you, or you can contact me directly. The regular shoots are 50 targets all on Sunday and the time is 9 am. The dates are as follows; May 4th, June 1st, July 13th, August 10th and Sept 14th. Please set aside some time to work these events. Keep breaking those targets.

SKEET & TRAP PRACTICE

Frank Mauri, Shotgun Chairman

The skeet and trap fields will be open for practice daily except Monday. Prior to the bar opening rounds shot must be paid for using the receipt pad & envelopes available in the lower clubhouse and in the exact amount owed. The sealed envelope should be left in the black mailbox located on the front wall of the bar next to the entrance door. After 12:30 pm, Tues. - Fri, the bar is open. Skeet and trap rounds must be paid at the bar and recorded in the book provided, located on the bar. Check and keep the receipt you receive from the bar maid indicating payment. Ideally, pay for your skeet or trap shooting first and get a receipt, then order and pay for any other item you wish. Shooting on Saturday and Sunday commences at 9 am, except during pheasant stocking season and terminates at dark. The bar is open these days beginning at 9:30 am. Log in your rounds shot in the book on the bar and pay the barmaid for the rounds, again, pay for your shooting before ordering drinks. Check and keep your receipt.

TRAP

The club has a registered trap shoot on May 18th. There most likely will be a work party on May 17th to get the fields ready. Some of the skeet fields will be closed. I will send out an email for help as time approaches. The doors to the trap houses need to be repaired/replaced, I will schedule a work party later this Spring.

For those that are interested in shooting trap, we generally shoot on most Saturdays. We would love to have a few more people to shoot with. Send me an email if you are interested. I will have a seminar as well for those that need to get familiarized with the skeet and trap machines.

HUNTING BADGES

Please mark your calendars as you will need to purchase your 2014 badge prior to October 1st. After that date, no badges will be issued. You must fill out your permission slips, for selecting the type of hunting activity you would like, selecting your fall hunting group, and finally purchasing your badge. Come September, if you have not completed your work hour requirement, or paid your obligations, you will be notified. You must pay for those work hours, and outstanding obligations or you will lose your hunting privileges and your badge. Tremendous amount of work goes into this program from permission slips, organizing forms, verifying information on the permission slips, notifying members that information was incorrect or left out, cross checking work hours, obligations paid for, and finally issuing badges. This is to ensure that everyone is eligible to hunt, after meeting all these requirements.

It is your responsibility! To make sure that information, work hours, obligations, and payments have been completed so to purchase your badge. Please keep your receipts. It is not the Hunt Chairman or the Club, it is you.

Remember, October 1st is the Deadline.

FISH COMMITTEE REPORT

The fish committee met on Jan. 18 to lay the groundwork for the upcoming season.

Rules for fishing the three ponds will be sent via email. All fishermen must purchase a badge for \$25 which entitles them to fish and also to hunt. The badges may be purchased at the bar.

Fish stockings will be on March 14, April 4, April 25 and a special stocking for the kid's derby on May 2. The stocking will be at about 4:30 pm each day so any who wish to come and help should be able to get there. Buttonball Trout Hatchery located very near the club will supply the fish and they will be in good shape since they have only a short trip from the hatchery to our ponds. Brook and rainbow trout will make up over 90% of the fish stocked with 12 – 14" fish the minimum size and a goodly number of 16"+ fish added as well. Brown trout will make up a few percent of the fish in the last stocking as they are more temperature resistant. Approximately 75 % of the fish will be stocked in the middle and lower ponds open to lure and bait fishing with the remainder going to the fly pond.

We are hosting a Veteran's fishing day as we did two years ago and it will be held on April 27 at the Fly pond from 9 am till Noon. Help would be greatly appreciated so that the Veterans can have a good time.

A Fly fishing tournament will be held on May 3 on the fly pond. The entry fee is \$20 and it will be a catch and release event. Sign-up sheet will be posted on the wall of the bar.

The Kid's fishing derby will be held Sunday May 4 from 8 am till 12 Noon also on the fly pond. Sign-up sheet for kids who will attend will be located on the wall of the bar. Twelve (12) years old is the maximum age for participants. Those who haven't any children of the right age can bring a nephew, niece, a relatives or close friends' child. Food will be provided free to the children while adults may buy food at the upper clubhouse kitchen.

We are seeking donations so as to purchase additional fish for the veteran's and our own kid's. A \$10 donation will buy one large fish or a couple of smaller ones. Please donate and help make the two events fun for the participants.
