HUNTING BADGE DEADLINE IS NEAR!

Please mark your calendars as you will need to purchase your 2016 badge prior to October 1st. After this date, no badges will be issued, unless you are a new regular member. You must fill out your permission slips, from selecting the type of hunting activity you would like, to selecting your fall hunting group, and finally purchasing your badge. Come September 30th, if you have not completed your work hour requirement, or paid your obligations, you will be notified. You must pay for those work hours, and any outstanding obligations or you will lose your hunting privileges and your badge. Tremendous amount of work goes into this program from permission slips, organizing forms, verifying information on the permission slips, notifying members that information was incorrect or left out, cross checking work hours, obligations paid for, and finally issuing badges. This is to ensure that everyone is eligible to hunt, after meeting those requirements.

It is your responsibility! to make sure that information, work hours, obligations, and payments have been completed so to purchase your badge. Please keep your receipts. It is not up to the Hunt Chairman or Club, it is you.

- 15 Set Back night, starts at 7 pm.



OCTOBER 11TH REGULAR MEMBERS ANNUAL ELECTIONS



The CTA (CT Trapshooting Assoc.) celebrated its 100th Anniversary shoot at the Hartford Gun Club on June 24-26th. There were approximately 250 shooters that participated in the event.

Even though the Fin only has a few members that shoot registered events, they did quite well at the shoot. Brian Scussel is the new State Champ in Doubles! He shot a 96x100. He was also High Over All, 658X700.

This is the first time that a FFF member has been HOA at the State shoot! Congrats Brian. Alan Gnann also had an outstanding weekend. He won his class in the Singles event shooting 194x200, won his Doubles class with a 87x100.

He came in 5th in the Handicap event with a 93x100. Bob Cooper finally made it up from FL, He won the Veteran Class in Handicap with a 93x100. Pete Kasacek shot his personal best with a 99 in the Singles event.

I traveled to the Grand American Trapshooting Championship in Sparta, IL in early August. This facility has 128 trap fields that span over 3 miles. It has been on my bucket list ever since it was built about 10 yrs ago.

Truly an amazing place. Well I was lucky enough to shoot my first 100 in a Handicap event. I was the only one out of the 1773 entries to do so to win the Championship for that day. The following day I shot a 194x200 in the Singles event to win Runner Up in my class.

It was a great experience, thinking about going back next year!

RIFLE COMMITTEE

It's September and the high power rifle matches has concluded. There were five (5) matches this year, all shooting at 200 yds. At each match you shoot 50 rounds various disciplines. Each year the number of shooters has gone down as with the shotgun sports. The 200 yd. line was rebuilt after years of washing out, plus the 50 yd line. This range is now in excellent shape. Target frames are stored in the small shed as you drive up to the rifle range, they contain frames that are 7 ft. tall so your rounds would impact the 200 yd berm. Reminder that members must pick up after they shoot.

There is no centerfired rifles, shotguns,, muzzle loaders or hand guns more powerful than a 44 mag ALLOWED ON THE PISTOL RANGE. You MUST uses the rifle range.

SPORTING CLAYS

Our season will close on Sept 18th. We had a Sporting Clays event each month with lots of shooters. I want to help those Club member's that could come out to help trap which makes these events successful. Without you, these events would not had taken place. I also want to thank my team of Matt Halloran, Mike Fromerth, Bruce Macaro, Jim Skoglund, Mark Holland, Ron Palmer, and Mike Holland, who sets up and runs each event to make sure each shooter enjoys themselves.
