



Reminder that Hunting season is just around the corner and with that comes the restriction for stocking days that all ranges are closed until 10 am Wednesday and Saturday.

Also, your Hunt Button must be purchase by October 1st. After this date only new members will be allow to purchase these buttons. All work hours and obligations must be paid for. For you deer hunters, only bow hunting is allowed on Club land and NO Sunday Hunting. Lease land Sunday hunting is allowed.

All State license and regulations plus The Fin Fur Feather Club's regulations must be followed.
