TRAP

Just a reminder to **PLEASE do not adjust the height of the targets in the trap houses**. The targets are set at a specific height for a reason. The trap house on field 5 is setup for trap doubles. **DO NOT change**. A lot of targets are wasted trying to change back to the correct way. Please use fields 6 and 7 to shoot regular trap. Also, when done shooting please do not leave the machine empty. This is happening way too often. Take all the cardboard to the burn barrel. If anyone is interested in a lesson on the basics of Trapshooting, please let me know. Any issues with the machines or equipment, please let me know.
